But how far back does this song go? Some historians point to a 1719 opera called The Kingdom of Birds, in which one character sings: In the fields of frost and snow, There I Keep My Father's Cows, Booin' Here, Booin' There, Everyone Where Boo, We Challenge All The Worries and Strife, in a Magical Country-Life. In 1908, a 74-year-old woman in a London work house was recorded singing a song called The Farmyard: Up Was I on my fa-ther's farm On May Day, Morn-ing ear-ly; Feed the cows of my pha-tera On May Day morn-ing ear-ly, from here and moo there, Behold, there is moo, behold, you are the prat. Six stayers come and gang long o' me to the cheerful green fields of the farm-yard. By 1917, a more recognizable version was published in a collection of World War I songs: Old McDougall had a farm in Ohio-y-o, And on this farm he had dogs in Ohio-y-oh, with a bow-wau here, and bow-wau there, Here's a bow, there's a bow, there's a bow, everywhere bow-wau. The state-of-the-art version simply reels off various animal barnities with accompanying sounds, each verse adding a previous sound to the long line until, towards the end of the song, the children did not esake, fit, bark, mew, giggle and cling. The song can last as long as the singers have patience and can think of new animals to add to the repertoire. With the origins returning to 1870s Wales, This Old Man is a fairly established nursery rhyme. What is believed to be the original version was not published until 1937, however, and the version, which is familiar to most of us, was published in 1906.
